You know you gotta



A Query Letter, is a short and sweet one page (300 words) note introducing yourself to an agent and asking if they're interested in representing your book.



# First, you need to understand what an agent is and does for you...

Agent: Steven Hutson, WordWise Media

Literary agents (aka authors' representatives), serve as intermediaries between writers and potential employers such as publishers and television producers.

### ES: ENGLISH





### In addition to finding a publisher to publish your manuscript, agents also negotiate contracts, pursue publicity, and advise clients in their careers.

All agents require a query letter for novels, poetry, screen plays, and nonfiction book ideas.

# It introduces you and your work!

### NO MORE THAN 300 WORDS!

Fiction Authors – you need to have a finished and polished manuscript before you begin querying.

Non-Fiction Authors – you need a book proposal.



# 1st Paragraph



### 1st paragraph (1 to 2 sentences)

Introduction (your bond – what you have in common... think as if you were dating this person).

This is your opening paragraph, your hello.



### **Example of an Introduction:**

Dear [Agent's Name], I hope this message finds you well. My name is [Your Name], and I am seeking representation for my debut novel. After researching agents and reading about your agency, I feel that you would be a great fit for my work.

# 2nd Paragraph



2nd paragraph (1 to 2 sentences)

Your book's hook!

Probably the most important line(s) in your query. The hook: the description of your story and the most critical query element; 150-300 words is sufficient for most narrative works.

Your hook should offer a moment of intrigue, peak the reader's interest, provide an interesting factoid that leaves the reader wanting to read more.



### **Example of a Hook:**

My novel, [Title], is a captivating story of love, loss, and redemption set against the backdrop of [Unique Setting]. This work of [Genre] will transport readers into a world of [Unique Element] and leave them breathless with its vivid characters, emotional depth, and breathtaking plot twists.

# 3rd Paragraph



3rd paragraph (1 to 2 sentences)

The housekeeping: your book's genre, category, word count, title/subtitle, sticky mash up



#### Example of

#### Genre:

[Title] is a work of [Genre]. It is a [Description of Genre] that is sure to appeal to fans of [Similar Authors or Books].

#### Word Count:

The manuscript is approximately [Word Count] words in length, and it has been professionally edited to ensure the highest quality of writing.

#### Stick Mashup:

# 4th Paragraph





4th paragraph (1 to 2 sentences)

Bio note; something about yourself, usually 50-100 words, writing credentials,

#### For non-fiction -

what makes you an expert on the topic, your industry knowledge/activity, author platform information.

#### **Example of Bio:**

I am an aspiring author with a passion for storytelling. While this is my first novel, I have been writing for [Amount of Time] and have received [Awards, Publications, or Other Accomplishments]. I am an active member of [Writing Group or Community] and have worked tirelessly to perfect my craft. I am excited about the opportunity to work with an agent who shares my passion for literature and is dedicated to helping me achieve my dreams.

# 5th Paragraph



### 5th paragraph (1 sentence)

Thank you and closing; final details, whether your manuscript (mss) has been professionally edited,

for non-fiction – if the proposal is finished.



### **Example of Close:**

My manuscript was professionally edited by [Editor's Name].

Thank you for your time and consideration. I look forward to hearing from you soon. Best regards, [Your Name]

# What agents DON'T like

- Words in Bold
- Pictures
- Talking about more than one book in a query
- Not having a finished manuscript (fiction writers)
- Poor story telling (fiction writers)





- Querying more than one agent at a time (and then not telling them)
- Querying the wrong agent (they don't represent your genre – wasting their time)
- Not having the right amount of word count for the genre
- Typos
- Bragging



- Lies
- Being rude
- Asking for free advice
- Making them think or do work just to read your query
- Emailing them to find out if they read it
